Our approach has been developed over more than 20 years. Challenge Partners was formed to spread the success of the London Challenge, which transformed the performance of schools and led to the development of Teaching Schools. Pupils in our partner schools achieve more and progress faster than the national average. Of the Challenge Partner schools inspected in 2017/18, 48% improved their Ofsted grade, compared to only 34% nationally.

By building a trusted practitioner-led network, we identify the knowledge and skills of the best, and facilitate collaboration with others, to reduce variability in provision. We link outstanding schools with external knowledge, to drive up the performance of all schools, leaders, teachers and pupils. This growing network includes more than 430 primary, secondary and special schools and alternative provision settings nationwide. Challenge Partners schools can access information, share good practice and expertise.

Schools are organised into local hubs, working together to secure improvements and personal development on shared priorities. They link with hubs around the country, and play a crucial role in facilitating collaboration and knowledge-sharing between schools.

Quality Assurance Review

We have developed a powerful tool for peer review and collaboration. The Quality Assurance Review is an opportunity for schools to work together through an open, challenging process which supports learning and reflection. These rigorous annual reviews take place over three days, and are led by an Ofsted-experienced Lead Reviewer, supported by senior leaders and headteachers from other schools in the network. This means they provide great professional development for reviewers, as well as sharp evaluation for the host school. Post review we put you in touch with relevant outstanding people and practice in the partnership and beyond to help accelerate your school's improvement.

Further strategic support is available to enhance the effectiveness of your teaching school alliance, local partnership or multi-academy trust, including Leadership Development Days and our collaborative, high-impact pupil premium programme developed by outstanding schools.

Pricing

Joining us at Challenge Partners costs £7.20 per pupil. The minimum fee is £2,978, with a special two-year membership offer for small schools¹ with fewer than 150 pupils of £1,750 plus VAT, per annum. The maximum fee is £9,800, with a discount for some groups of schools paying substantially more. There are also special offers for those renewing for a fourth year or more.
